This season presented your executive with a workload unprecedented in the short history of the Association.

There was the massive change in administrative policy by the District Club in respect of Rugby League in the Penrith District required that our Association, and indeed all areas of Rugby League had to amend their thinking in order to meet those new demands set upon them.

DISTRICT CLUB.

Speaking of the District Club, this is where I would like to begin my report. I am sure that all supporters of Rugby League in this District were pleased that Penrith in 1984 lost that "EASY BEAT" tag. It was great to see our first grade team still a chance of making the final five with one round to play only to find the hurdle of beating Parramatta too high. Nevertheless it is now recognised that Penrith don't need overpriced imported players but a sprinkling of experience coupled with very talented local content is the formula to success. I am sure our congratulations of the whole Association go to Tim Sheens for a tremendous effort especially in his first season in coaching. Further to this players such as Royce Simmons, Greg Alexander and Brad Izzard had great seasons. The poultus of awards collected between all of these men was evidence of a fine season.

There were members of our Association who achieved at the District Club Level. Jack Turner our long serving life member was appointed to assist the district club in assessing grade referees' performances and the wealth of knowledge he has gained here is certain to benefit our members currently running in grade and those aspiring to that honour. Jack Harris was our representative on the 5 X 5 committee making sure that our thoughts to this end are reflected and are beneficial to the efficient working of that committee.

At this point I must thank two people from the Club. Firstly, Rosemary Wilkinson for her many hours of clerical assistance in the typing and remitting of the appointments plus all those other little things that tend to go unnoticed and to Roger Cowan for the many hours spent around negotiating tables, sometimes in heated debate.

May I say that like all in the District there is a genuine desire to want to represent Penrith. The success at District Club level does filter back to our Association. The basis for a great 1985 has certainly been laid.

JUNIOR LEAGUE.

Once again our members were called upon to referee a vast number of games, some 249 in fact every weekend. This coupled with early season trials, representative trials and Semi Finals, Finals and Grand Finals ensured a workload far in excess of what should have been expected from every weary member.

Members of our Association have achieved within Junior League circles. Barry Beveridge was appointed Coaching Director of the Junior League, an honour for Barry and a reward for diligence and dedication. Laurie Dunn was appointed as a selector for the Jersey Flegg team narrowly beaten by Balmain in the Final. Arthur Thomas had his son Colin in the Flegg team with the future for Colin predicted to be very bright. Our congratulations go to all of these members.

N.S.W.R.F.L.R.A.

This year saw a mixed bag for Penrith at this level. We lost Steve Tyrrell, Jack Turner and Herb Rædy from grade but did have Gary Haines graded and Barry Barnes ran in first grade all season and refereed the Poms and the Kiwis second encounter at New Zealand. Gary Haines proved he has the ability to go a long way. Gary ran touches and centres during the course of the season culminating in his appointment to a third grade touch during the final series; top work indeed.

This season witnessed two important changes in format for referees at this level. Firstly the Business Hoses competition was refereed by members from District Associations enabling those referees another opportunity to impress those that matter. Secondly the Big Ben sponsored All Schools State Knock Out was decentralised this season with many games played at Whalan. Members both Senior and Junior proudly represented this Association. These members were Noel Davis, Barry Beveridge, Michael Beveridge, Phillip Heeb, Peter Whitney, Peter Hollebon and Phillip Baker.

The thanks of all members should go to Michael Quinn and Michael Bunnage for serving our Association as delegates at meetings of the N.S.W.R.F.L.R.A. Their contribution in this regard ensures valuable information is not lost to this Association. Congratulations should go to Noel Cahill for his appointment as delegate to the N.S.W.R.F.L.R.A. on behalf of the Victorian Branch, a bold attempt indeed to spread the game further afield.

The inter district games provided Penrith with Centres and Touches with Dean Parkin, Kevin Russell, Tony Butler and yours truly running. Kevin enhanced his claim for status "down town" starting on Flegg Touches and finishing on Flegg Centres. Well Done, Kevin.

Our thanks must go to Max Tomsett from the N.S.W. Advisory Board for watching our members on Grand Final Day at Penrith Park.

Part (2) SECRETARYS REPORT.

Part One of my report dealt with events and achievements that occurred outside the Association but heavily involved our members. Part Two concerns itself with the Association itself.

JUNIOR BRANCH.

This season saw an attempt by the Senior Branch Executive to establish better communication with the Junior Branch Executive in order that the Junior Association would be better informed of matters pertaining to the Association in general. This was achieved and can be improved upon even further. In this part of the report I will not dwell any further as our Juniors have made a massive contribution to the report and I will not spoil the excellent reading it contains. However a word of warning. It is fair to want to make a contribution to the efforts of an Association HOWEVER, Over Exuberance will lead to a path of Self Destruction, think carefully about this.

SENIOR BRANCH.

1984 saw more candidates sit for referees tickets than the last five seasons but it is unfortunate that many of these applicants do not intend to be active referees. We can only try.

Finally 1984 saw the total revision of the constitution as a response to its revision in the N.S.W.R.F.L.R.A. By the time this report is read it will be formally adopted and its contents will vastly improve those statutes by which our Association is ruled and governed.

Social.

Away from the football field and to the Social side of things and 1984 provided yet again a hectic social calendar but a much enjoyed one indeed. I must take time to point out that I have been a member of many football and cricket clubs but I have yet to come across a more dedicated nor organised band of people than our Social Committee. I say people because the wives of the members of the committee play such an important part in the success. Two

events stand out in 1984.

Bellhaven Reception Rooms provided an excellent setting for a simply terrific night. With our host Johnny Lockwood providing excellent entertainment, delicious food and warm company our night was topped off by the presence of distinguished guests Peter Anderson and Roger Cowan and their wives this will rate as probably the best Ladies' Night ever.

The aims of the Grade/ Inter District coaching officer, are to prepare the Association Referees both physically and mentally for the rigorous duties of Grade and Inter District Refereeing.

However, this task cannot be done by the coaching officer alone. He will need the assistance of alot of people within the Association, such as, the Social Committee, Video Committee and Executive alike, but most of all he will need the undivided assistance of the Selected Training Squad.

Whilst it is understood that 1984 has been a long and arduous season and late demands by the inter district squads has placed further strain on the Association, it is my considered opinion that together without of continuing development of Junior Football every referee has a committment to assist in that development. This committment was displayed by a majority of the squad in their support of the mentioned demands.
