The standard of refereeing around the district and through the various levels has been as good, if not better than in the past.

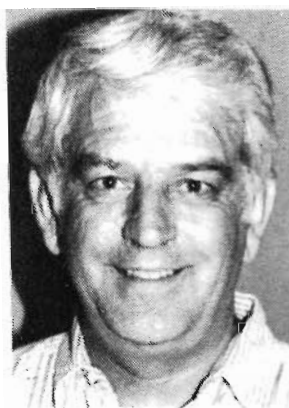
Overall I feel that every member of the Association can feel proud and satisfied with their efforts.

Simply the best

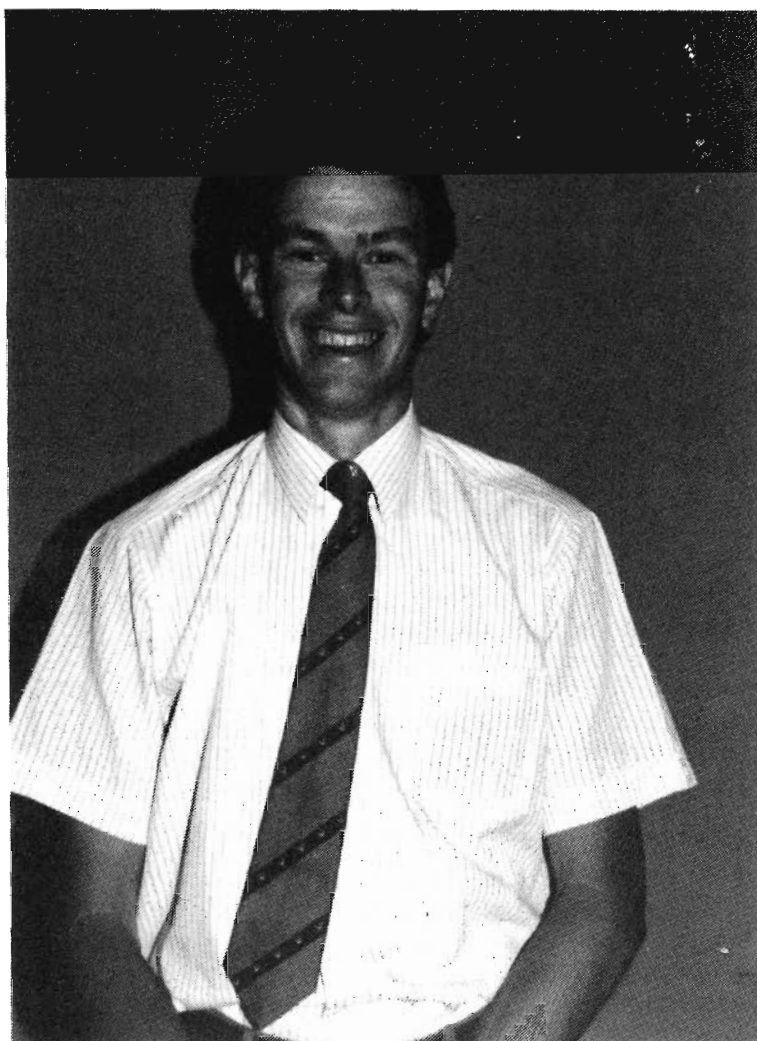
After another year of agendas, correspondence lists and answering machines, Association Secretary, Gary Haines presents his report.

Memories of a very wet 1989 were revived early in the season when the rain again caused disruption to the Junior League competition. However this just happened to be a hiccup in a very successful year for the Association.

Several important and crucial decisions were made early in the season and with the support of the members, the Junior League and the District Club, they provided the necessary impetus to ensure that 1990 was one of the best years on record.

The appointment of a Referees' Co-ordinator was the first of many successes for the

The first year is always the hardest and with a little fine tuning, 1991 promises to be even better for the active referees.

John was ably assisted by Peter Browne and Noel Cahill who were responsible for those dreaded appointments. These three men brought a new and sensible approach to the most unwanted job and I offer my congratulations to them.

Recruitment of referees is an ongoing commitment for the Association and 1990 was no exception. John Jordan and Jim Kelly tackled the task of providing us with new members to ease the strain.

Their efforts were outstanding resulting in 23 new mini-mod referees, 3 junior referees and 6 international referees. Their work is further reflected in the weekly appointments for both Saturdays and Sundays, particularly when A Grade referees have just one game. Well done John and Jim.

Each year brings unexpected challenges and the first of these was to find a new sponsor, following the sudden termination of our agreement

with the Blue Mountains and Riverlands Community Credit Union.

The void was quickly filled by the State Bank who have proven to be a very supportive and professional sponsor. My personal thanks goes to Bill Gainsford who was instrumental in providing the "tough yards" with the sponsorship. To Sharon Buckland, Peter Caves, Jim Flynn and all their staff, thank you.

It's often been said that the yardstick for the success for any Association is the success of its District Club. Well the success of the Penrith Club in 1990 certainly gives everyone renewed confidence for 1991 and beyond.

Undoubtedly the appointment of Phil Gould was the major factor in Penrith's success. The professionalism and pride instilled into the team was reflected on and off the field, but unfortunately the Winfield Cup got away at the final hurdle. Every Panther supporter should be justifiably proud of the club's efforts in all grades in 1990. Congratulations to Greg Alexander, John Cartwright, Brad Fittler and Mark Geyer on their selection in the Kangaroo team - four local juniors!

The District Club also took a new direction in the administration of Rugby League with the appointment of Don Feltis as Rugby League Manager.

Don worked tirelessly behind the scenes and was always available to the Association to

discuss any matters raised by the Executive. Consultation and not confrontation was definitely to the fore in 1990.

Administering Rugby League in Penrith is not an easy task and the Association acknowledges the efforts of Bill Hubbard and all members of the Junior League in 1990. There aren't many "growth industries" around at the moment, however Rugby League in Penrith is one of them.

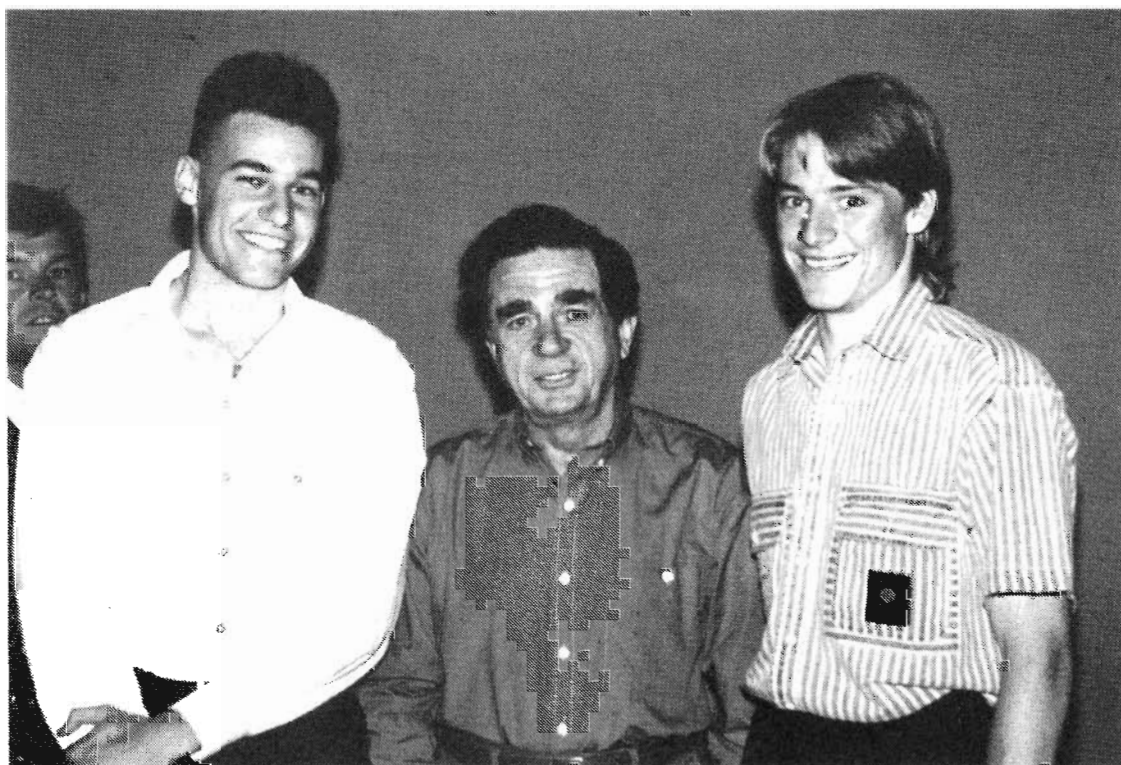
were appointed as touch judges with Darren also participating in the Harold Matthews competition. A strong squad has been selected for summer training and Penrith will be ready when the call is made!

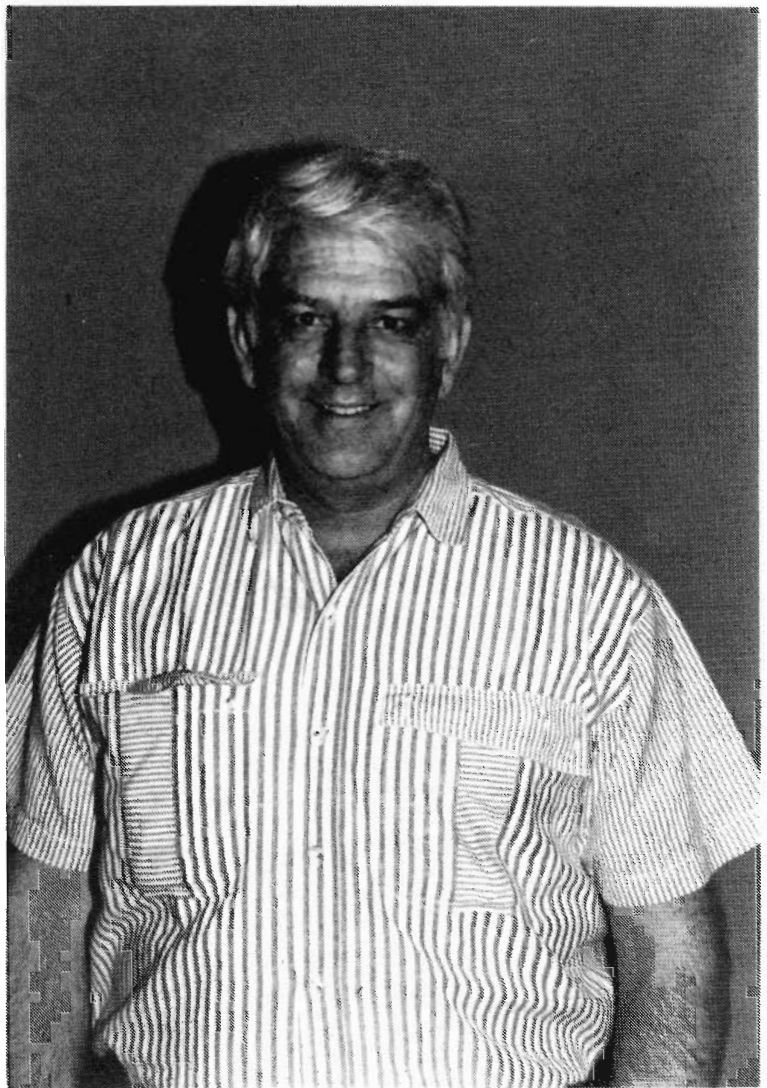

A year of change for the Association as well as the District Club has just passed. The creation of the position of Referees' Co-ordinator set the stage for the many challenges that faced our referees and myself.

The season commenced with the introduction of a pre-season competition by the Junior League. This competition saw all first and second division clubs competing for points and money.

This period was used to evaluate the performances and fitness of our referees. Many referees were given the opportunity to officiate in higher grades than they had attained previously. In all cases, these referees performed very creditably.

During this period we asked referees to change styles and approaches to positional play from the common practice of controlling the game from over the ruck to a position on the

five metres with more selective use of the ruck position.

This approach made for better control of the game as a whole and gave teams the opportunity to play fast and open football with a consistent five metres. It also promoted consistency across the grades and throughout our ranks.

During the pre-season we introduced fitness testing and developed profiles which showed the strengths and weaknesses of all our referees. Minimum standards of fitness were set for all A Grade referees to attain.

By the completion of the testing period, it was very pleasing to note that all who took part, from seniors through to juniors and across the grades were able to pass. Our thanks must go to Association Trainer, Adrian Parsonage and Tony Butler for their expert input.

From there we moved on to the season proper. The Junior Coaching Panel was re-introduced to assist our younger and inexperienced referees in the Saturday competition.

Prior to the semi-finals the Junior Coaching Panel had covered 75% of mini-mod games played. To those who gave their time and assistance, I extend the Association's thanks.

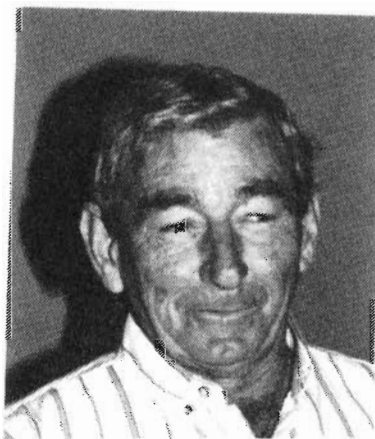
For the Sunday referees we abolished the numbering system previously used to grade referees and placed them into groups based upon their ability and fitness levels thus allowing plenty of scope for promotion.

The Appointments Board was

put in place with the selection of Noel Cahill and Peter Browne under my chairmanship. Peter was given the responsibility of administering Saturday appointments. The Board met each Sunday evening where the performance of all referees were discussed and strengths and weaknesses noted.

A new form of reporting was introduced to highlight all facets of the game. This gave the referee the ability to dissect and evaluate their own performance.

As the collection of reports on each individual referee grew, he or she was able to see how they were performing in each category. Areas of weakness were identified and constructive advice from the Appointments Board members were able to eliminate many of these.

Working closely with the Appointments Board, an Advisory Panel of active referees was formed. This allowed far wider coverage of matches and assisted the development of a greater number of members. It was

pleasing to see the Panel and the Board work with a uniformity of purpose.

To compliment our development programme, the Board held three seminars throughout the season. The first of these featured guest speakers Frank Johnson and Brad Levy from the NSWRL Coaching Clinic. The second evening which was promoted for the benefit of Mini-Mod referees and coaches, was addressed by the 'father' of the modified code, Peter Corcoran.

The final seminar held just prior to the semi-finals was a sound preparation for the weeks that lay ahead. The attendance at each of these seminars exceeded my own expectations and I certainly appreciated member's input.

Exchange programmes were again undertaken with Illawarra, Tweed Heads and Victoria. To the referees who were selected to represent Penrith Referees' Association in these programmes, well done. We look forward to a continuation of these exchanges in the future with the possibility of further expansion.

Congratulations to Tom Peet and Tony Danks upon being graded in 1990. A new inter-district squad has been selected comprising Tony Fahey, Anthony Goldsmith, Wayne McDermott, Darren Parsons, Jason Robinson, Russell Turner, Michael Warnock, Allan Wheatland and Brett Wright.

These members now undertake a skills and development programme over the summer months to prepare them for

next season's Inter-District competition. I hope you all perform to the Association's expectations and move on to join the ranks of the NSW Referees' Association.

As members are aware I form part of the Penrith District Development Committee. The Committee meets monthly and has a charter to involve itself in any project that will further the development of Rugby League in the District on both a senior and junior level. It is a committee which is financed by the District Club.

Over the past season, the Committee have given financial support to the programmes established for the development of refereeing in the District. To the Committee members, I offer our thanks for your support.

At the start of the 1990 season, the need for the recruitment of referees was obvious. A suitable advertising campaign was devised with the assistance of our Executive and the Development Committee. This campaign yielded immediate success and I would like to thank the coaching officers for their whole-hearted efforts in getting all the new candidates their respective tickets.

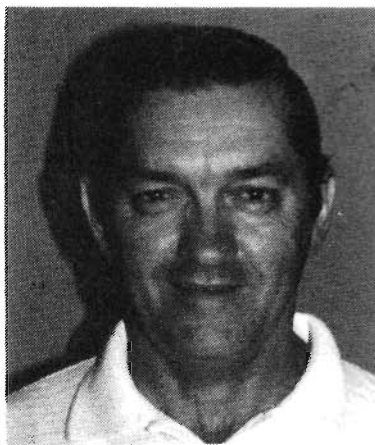
In the end...

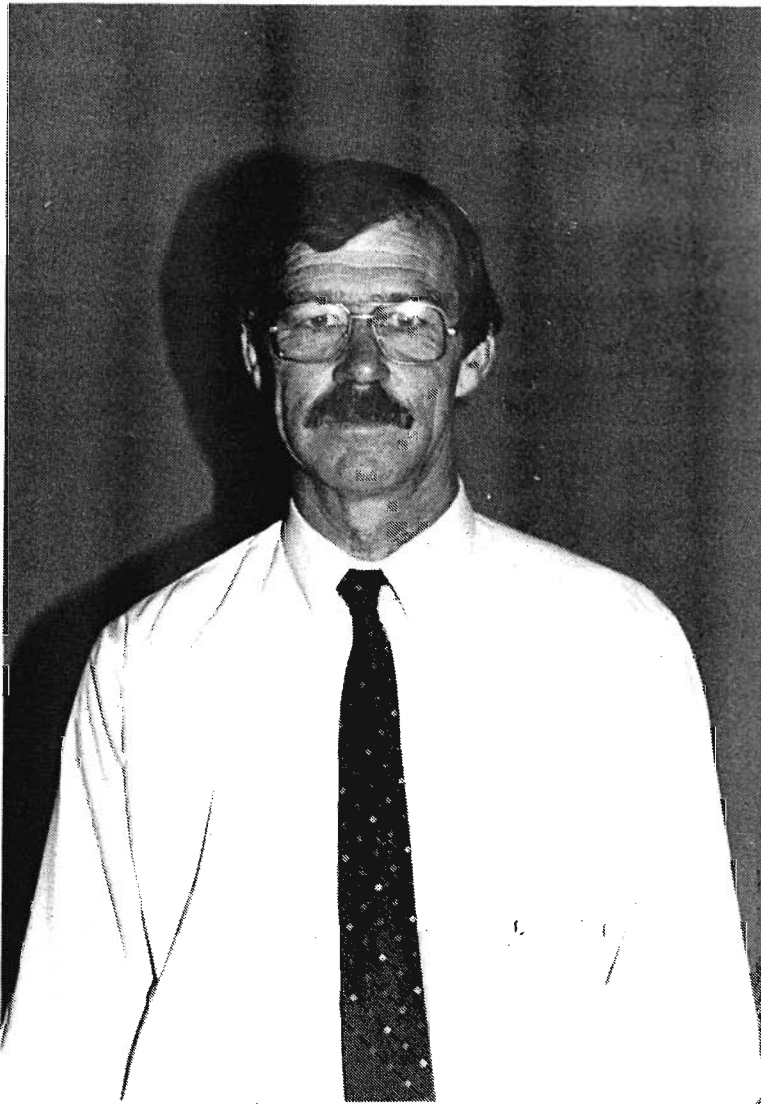

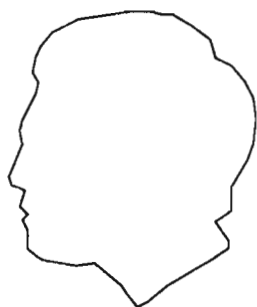
Coaching classes bring success

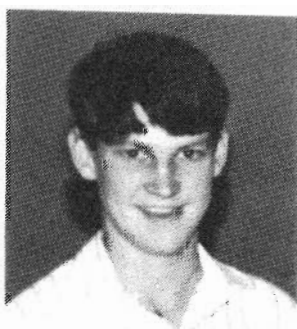

Junior Branch President, Jason Robinson gives his final address before moving on to senior membership.

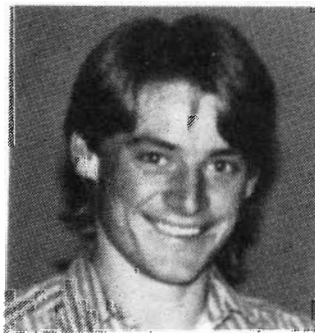
The time has come to hang up our whistles and let the referees gear gather dust once again as another successful season for the Junior Branch draws to a close.
