REFEREE'S CO-ORDINATOR

Mr Chairman and members,

I am pleased to present my report for Season '94 on the commitment development and on-field performances of our active referees.

Each football season presents new challenges and 1994 was not to be any different; with the emphasis placed on training, skills development, discipline and providing clear and precise guidelines to the members on their performance assessments.

The "unofficial" season began with a group of dedicated members toughing it from late January in the summer sun. They were soon joined en masse by their colleagues with official training commencing at Jamison Park in mid February. I was very satisfied with the training aspect, which I believe was at a level not attained for many years.

Much credit must go Noel Cahill and Graeme Heape who worked in tandem to ensure the members were physically at their very best, particularly during the final series matches. To both me, I express my gratitude and that of the active referees for their efforts during 1994. On the negative side, strong action must always be enforced on the small minority who continue to sidestep their responsibilities to training.

Members did not have to wait long to get on the field, with the "first call" going out in January and official trials commencing in March. This provided the Appointments Board with the opportunity to assess the talents of some new members and also the young guns who would push for higher honours later in the year. We were not disappointed in our quest for good performances and this was to be borne out when grand finals came around in August and September.

All active referees were provided with written advice on "The Procedures and Guidelines for the Appointment of Referees", which proved to be an invaluable guide for the members. The Board was able to outline their aims for the season and all members were left in no doubt as to the action to be taken concerning on field performances. The board stuck rigidly to the guidelines and all members can feel confident they were assessed fairly and given every opportunity to air any problems they experienced with their refereeing.

1994 also provided an opportunity to address an area of great importance - skills development of referees. Several sessions throughout the season were dedicated to scrums, rucks, positional play, communication and touch judging. I am grateful for the assistance provided by Noel, Jack, Brett and Macca on various occasions during the year.

When looking for a benchmark for 1994, you only need to cast back to the A Grade Grand Final from the previous season. As most of your know, this game went into extra time and then a replay! 1994 was looking ominously similar with the scores tied late in the second half, but everyone breathed a sigh of relief when first Cambridge Park, then Emu Plains scored, with victory going to Emu Plains in the final minute.

This game also represented Brett Lynch's second consecutive A Grade Division 1 Grand Final and culminated an outstanding season for him. Brett was also appointed to referee the Harold Matthews and Jersey Flegg finals and was selected by the NSWRL to officiate at the Australian Schoolboys' Championship in Darwin. Truly an outstanding performance.

Several other referees are also worthy of mention for their dedication and success during the '94 season. Steve McFarlane refereed the A Grade Division 2 Grand Final; Adam Shillito the Under 15 Division 1 Grand Final and Brendan Egan the Under 12 Division 1 Grand Final for the third successive year. Members who achieved a high level of attendance t training include Shannon Lewis, Steve Tibbetts, Steve McFarlane, Dave Wilson, Adam Shillito, Aaron Jones and the "Yates family".

Next year will again present new challenges for the Association and the active referees. I firmly believe the foundations have been laid for greater success for the active referees and this is confirmed by the addition of Aaron Jones, Darren Parsons and George Jankowski to the NSWRL Junior Representative squad.

It would be remiss if I did not mention the members of the Appointments Board - the two Peters, a great help; Advisory Panel and Development Panel. My thanks for all your efforts and contributions - so often taken for granted.

In closing I would like to take this opportunity to wish all members and their families a happy and safe Christmas and a prosperous 1995.

Appreciation is extended to the Principal at St Dominics for making two classrooms available each Thursday night for the classes. The efforts of those members who assisted us to instruct candidates is also appreciated.
