## **PRESIDENT'S REPORT**



The 2001 season has been both challenging and rewarding for our Association.

The loss of our major sponsor meant that purchases of gear for a large number of new and current members had to be paid from accumulated funds. We are currently awaiting the results of a proposal for sponsorship for the 2002 season and onwards.

Without a major sponsor our Association will be unable to continue subsidising gear purchases at the present level.

We began the season with the loss of a great number of experienced referees from Sunday football and a shortage of Saturday referees. Recruitment has been extremely successful. Forty new referees have been accredited, with the majority refereeing actively each week. Training and Development for referees is at a level, which I believe is superior or equal to any other association at present. The contribution from Allan Farlow, Brett Lynch, Jason Robinson, Kelvin Jeffes, Peter Filmer and Gary Haines has been invaluable in this area.

Representation in the Junior Representative Squad has been strong with Phillip Haines, Ricky McFarlane, Greg Yates and Grant Atkins officiating regularly. John Woods and Jay Farlow travelled to Dubbo with the Penrith Development Squads and a number of younger referees performed in promotional matches at Penrith Park with distinction.

Support for all our endeavours from the Penrith Junior League has been strong. The Code of Conduct for players, officials and spectators has been consistently implemented and I would like to acknowledge the efforts of Don Feltis and his Board of Management in this area.

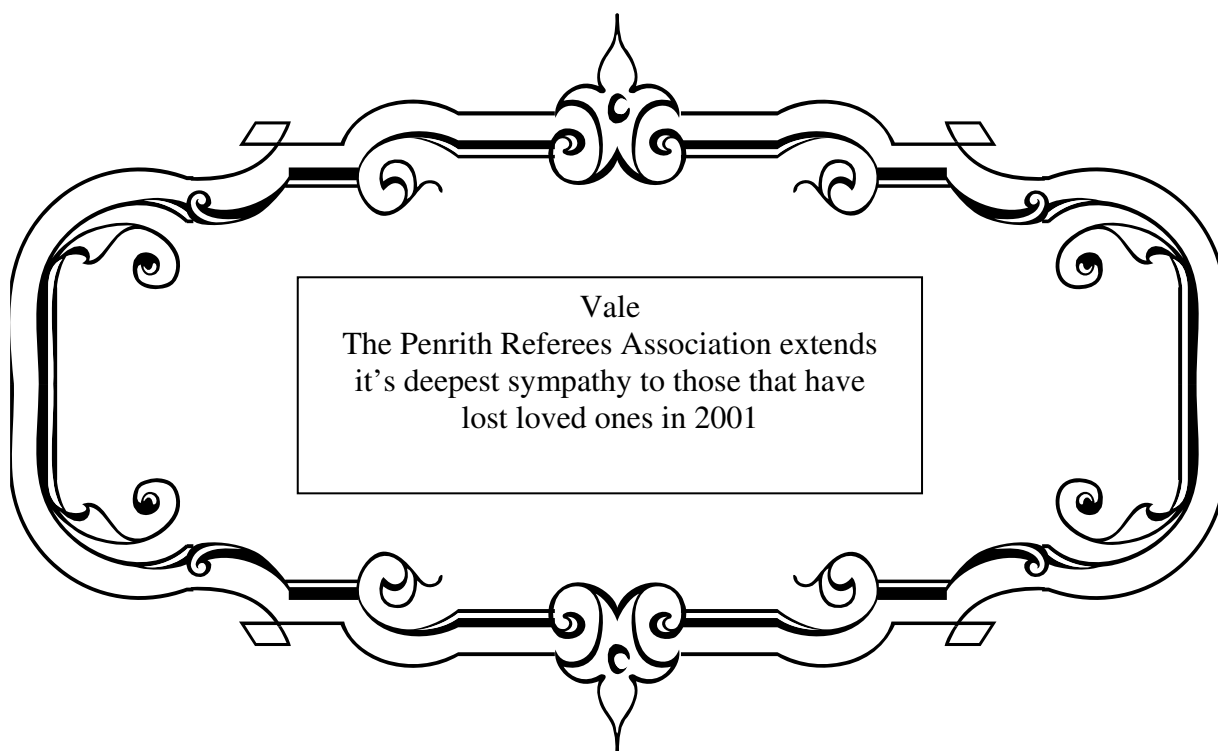

# **TREASURER'S REPORT**

I have great pleasure in presenting the 35<sup>th</sup> Annual Report and Financial Statements to members. Please note, the Financial Statements for the Association are unaudited. This was due to the late arrival of the October bank statement and the tight printing schedule for the Annual Report. This will be supplied to members at the Annual General Meeting.

I would like to thank Russell Turner, our ex-Treasurer, for the hard work he put in last year to ensure that the Association's accounts met the requirements of the Government's new legislation in regard to taxation etc. This gave a great basis for consolidation on which to work in this changeover period.

## **Referees**

A big 'thank you' to members for their prompt attention in supplying financial information when requested including the submission of hobby statements and/or ABN's.

Itemised statements of earnings were circulated to all members at the end of the season. This was carried over from last year as members found these statements to be of great value.

Active referees were supplied with an Association's sports bag at no cost to themselves to be used when on the Association's activities.

Members of the Development Panel who submitted reports to the Appointments Board were financially rewarded for their time in the 2001 season. This was a first for our Association. Further remuneration should be investigated for work carried out by members on behalf of the Association.

## **Assistant Treasurer**

At the 2000 Annual General Meeting, members formally adopted the position of Assistant Treasurer and I wish to congratulate John Jordan for being elected. During the year, he has done a tremendous job getting the changes every Sunday night from the Appointments Board and recording these in an appropriate manner. This has made my job as Treasurer easier and more enjoyable.

## **Accounts**

I have continued to use "QuickBooks", as adopted by Russell, and this has ensured all accounts have been kept in accordance with the new government regulations.

Quarterly Business Activity Statements have been submitted to the Australian Tax Office. All the Association's tax obligations have been met for season 2001.



## **Assets**

During the year, the Association has bought the following capital items:

- Multifunction Centre for the Secretary
- Equipment for active referees, e.g. heart rate monitors and on-field communication gear
- Answering Machine for the Referee's Co-ordinator.

An Asset Register has been established and will continue to be updated during season 2002 and beyond.

## **Telephone**

With the accountability and entitlements for telephone calls tightened last year, this area of the accounts has seen a notable decrease in costs to the Association. Copies of tendered accounts ensured claims were processed in an efficient manner.

A dedicated telephone line and number for the Association's Secretary was approved and installed at the start of this financial year. This ensured accountability of the Secretary's telephone costs.

## **Board of Management**

At the Special General Meeting, members passed unanimously to move to a 'Board of Management' style of administration. The structure of the Association is shown elsewhere in the Annual Report.

The Association's financial mechanisms will not change dramatically: the main area of change will be in the summary reporting of the Association's financial statements to ordinary members. At present this is done on a monthly basis to coincide with the General Meetings. In season 2002 under the new structure this will be done every three months. Monthly reports will need to be completed for the Board of Management Meetings and confirmation will still need to be obtained for expenses incurred.

## **Cheque Requisitions**

The success of the process developed last year was adhered to again in season 2001. This has enabled the tracking of all cheques written on behalf of the Association. However, members must include original and/or copy of tax invoices with cheque requisitions, and approval must be obtained prior to their submission for payment. This will save the Treasurer much time in follow up work.

Please be aware that the GST component of the expense must be included on the cheque requisition form. The GST amount is shown on the tax invoices/receipts and if GST is included adopt the "1/11 rule"; that is 1/11 times the Total Amount.

## **Yearly Budgeting of Finances**

I believe that the new Executive Committee and Board of Management should develop a written budget strategy at the start of each financial year. Consideration must be given to all ongoing expenses and possible capital acquisitions required for the successful running of the Association in the forthcoming season. This would allow future projection of advancement of the Association.

## **Thanks**

When I first put up my hand for the position of Treasurer, I wanted to give something back to a hobby that I enjoy doing very much. This statement has proven to be true and anyone interested in taking up an administration role within the Association should consider the rewards this work gives. My family, in particular, Mum & Dad, Debbie and Andrew have been supportive of my role since day 1, lending advice wherever needed

I would like to thank my fellow executive members (Peter, Brett, Graeme, John Robbo) and Gary Haines for their support. I appreciate their help and assistance to overcome any major issues that had to be addressed.

My Assistant Treasurer, John Jordan has, as stated earlier, done an outstanding job collating all the match fees and other financial matters.

The District Club and, in particular Don, and Helen for their help with releasing draws, results and information on Junior League Clubs, especially in respect of financial matters. In addition, Andy Faz for his involvement with Nutri-Grain Cup matches.

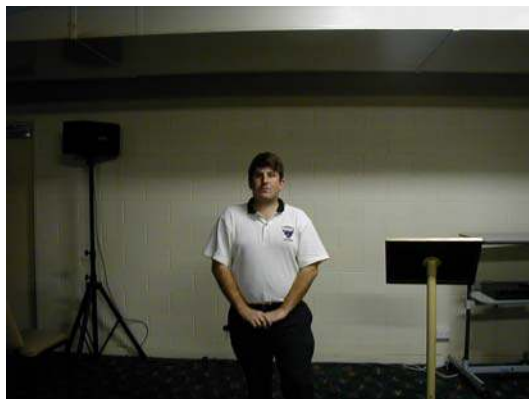
Also thanks to Russell and Jason Robbo for their work as unpaid Auditors. They have kept me in line and I value their input.

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## **COORDINATOR'S REPORT**



I am pleased to present my report to the members for Season 2001.

The focus for me in 2001 was on improving the skills of the referees, recruitment and rewarding performance. I have no doubt we achieved great success in all three areas.

For some of our members the season commenced last October with the re-formation of the Referees' Development Squad. This group of young referees was identified as those that will form the nucleus of the active referees in the foreseeable future. With financial support from Panthers Coaching and Development Manager, Jim Jones, the parameters of the six-month program were set – skills, skills and more skills.

Allan Farlow led the group during the summer months with an excellent variety of training drills and activities, which set the platform for the upcoming season. The highlight for many was the training session held at Weir Reserve under the guidance of NRL referee Steven Clark. Even the intermittent rain didn't deter Steven whose attitude was "you stop when you drop". We were also fortunate to be invited to train with the NSWRLRA Junior Representative Squad at Lidcombe Oval that provided the members with an insight of the requirements to succeed at the next level. Jason Robinson, Brett Lynch and Kelvin Jeffes all provided valuable support and advice to the squad members and I thank them for their positive contribution.

The 2002 Development Squad has recently been selected which includes experienced, albeit young referees blended with some fresh faces that will gain valuable experience from their participation. We will aim to set the highest standards with the support of Panthers, the coaching staff and the members themselves.

Association training commenced in February under the guidance of Allan Farlow. The younger members showed the way with a willingness to improve their fitness, their skills and their knowledge of the game. The improved level of fitness shone through during the latter half of the season and also with the whitewash of our friends from Parramatta in the annual training challenge. We look forward to next year with relish.

The first request for trials was received in December but the next priority was recruitment. The Association had gone through a metamorphosis losing several experienced referees in recent years and relying on some of its active members to fill the void far too early in their careers.

Once again we adopted a weekend recruitment program with coaching classes held at the Rugby League Complex in February and May. A five-week course was also held on Thursday nights at St Dominic's College. The outcome of the recruitment program was an astonishing **41** new referees – an outstanding result!

My thanks to the coaching directors, Fred Lucas and John Jordan for their efforts this season along with great support from Barry Beveridge and Chris Heinemeyer. Some of our young referees undertook practical and theory sessions with the new recruits as part of their level 3 accreditation program. To Grant Atkins, Phillip Haines, Rickey McFarlane and Greg Yates well done and thank you.



2001 also saw the reintroduction of the pre-season seminar that was held in February at the Rugby League Complex. More than 40 members attended a great day that included a variety of topics and guest speakers. I would like to extend my appreciation to Don Feltis and Jack Meyers from the Penrith Junior League, Peter Bungate from NSWRLRA and members of the Association who all contributed to the success of the day.

The trial games provided an opportunity for members to clear the cobwebs or in the case of our new colleagues a chance to gain some on field experience prior to the start of the competition. It also provided the Appointments Board the chance to gauge the progress of the referees to determine if they were ready to step up to the plate.

The sheer volume of games played in the Penrith Junior League every weekend continues to amaze the most ardent of rugby league followers and challenge the members' resolve and my patience! More than 200 games were played every weekend with a total of 51 grand finals plus Panther Trophy, Nutri Grain Cup and a plethora of school football to boot. How do we do it?

The answer is through dedication, determination and commitment by a **team** of outstanding people. The efforts of the Appointments Board, Advisory Panel and Development Panel deserve recognition, but most importantly it's the active referees particularly those new members who took up the whistle, that deserve our praise and ongoing support. I thank each and everyone one of you for your efforts in 2001 and look forward to you all returning next year.

The final series in 2001 ranks as one of the best ever and I offer my congratulations to Phillip Haines (A Grade Division 1), Chris Heinemeyer (A Grade Division 2) and Daniel Olford (Under 15 Division 1) on achieving the major appointments this year – well done.

My season as Referees' Coordinator was thoroughly enjoyable and rewarding and was due to the tremendous support and advice of many people:

- The Appointments Board – Graeme, Barry, John and Peter. You guys toil hard for very little reward and recognition;
- The best coaching and training staff anywhere – Allan, Brett, Jason and Kelvin;

# **2001 TRAINING REPORT**

Training during 2001 has had slightly different format to previous seasons and could be divided into four stages:



## **Off-season Training. (Development Squad)**

The goal of the off-season training with the Development Squad was to help build level of aerobic fitness and camaraderie among the Development Squad members. This is especially important for the Inter-district Squad members, who have fitness tests in November and February, and sometimes begin officiating in trials in November or December.

The NRL's Steven Clark paid a visit to the squad on a drizzly evening at Regatta Park. Who could forget THAT hill, or countless times we hit the punching bags. Steve's support, and his influence on the Development Squad is always well received, and certainly most appreciated.

After many laps of the sand on Manly beach, the off-season rounded down with some more fitness testing and the introduction of some skills and drills to switch us back into football mode before the start of the season. The results of the NSWRL fitness tests indicated that the off-season training was well worthwhile.

## **Pre-Season Training (Association)**

The main objective of the pre-season training is to work off the Christmas pudding and remind our bodies that they've got some running to do. It's also a great time to catch up with our teammates and welcome some new friends.

As with the off-season training, the emphasis was on aerobic fitness, stretching techniques, and built up to skills and drills, with a little anaerobic work. As the season proper approached, we were ready for our Regular Season Training.

## **Fitness and Conditioning (Tuesdays)**

During the regular season training phase we focussed more heavily on match specific activities, while maintaining our focus on fitness. This was achieved by adding different activities, such as sprint work, agility and mobility exercises to the training regime.

One of the more interesting and "learning" exercises we conducted was having the members of the Development Squad conduct training sessions. Lesson One was, obviously, "It's not as easy as it looks". It did however add to the variety of the training sessions, showed us what people had learnt and were very beneficial sessions for everyone involved. Who's going to be first next year guys?

The success of the training program was obvious when the annual exchanges with Parramatta Referees were held. During both sessions, Penrith's Referees took the

trophy by winning the most points during the combined training nights. By far the most pleasing results were from the “beep test”. During both of the combined sessions with Parramatta, the scores were extremely close after the team events, and it was Penrith’s outstanding results in the beep test that made the difference. Congratulations to all of the Penrith team, and a big thanks to Parramatta for making the event a success.

We averaged 18 members at our Tuesday night sessions. A pretty good number, but it represents less than one-fifth of active referees. For the first time in many years all of our First Division A Grade referees were able to attend training. Unfortunately, this was not a regular occurrence either. The core group at Tuesday night training has been a fantastic group of our younger referees. Although there are one or two who need regular “counselling”, the group’s enthusiasm, keenness to learn and teamwork were infectious, if not inspirational. To that 20% of active referees who choose to train with the Association, congratulations and thank you. To the rest, we invite you along to train with us next year... maybe the younger ones can teach you a thing or two.

### **Skills and Drills (Thursday)**

At the completion of the Development squad training provided an ideal opportunity to invite all active members to take part in Thursday Training, with the emphasis being on match related skills, such as 10 metres, concentration, video review, positioning and communication drills.

It was pleasantly surprising that over half of the members taking part in the skills sessions were not members of the development squad, and in fact many were training on Tuesday as well as Thursday. This dedication and enthusiasm from the younger members, and the experience and professionalism from the development squad members was a good mix, ensuring that we all learned and became better referees for the experience.

Although a very successful training year, there were some disappointments from a “staff” point of view. Some of the concerns that we are presented with are the percentage of members actually attending training (less than 20%), and the number of the more senior referees who cannot or do not attend. As the development programs continue to be successful, perhaps the Association, via the Coordinator and Appointments Board, could put more emphasis on training when trying to split competitive referees. In 2001 only one third (three of nine) of the members appointed as central referees to the Sunday Grand Finals were regular attendees at training. If our training programs were to continue to be considered successful, the fitter, more mature, and more competent referees would be those being developed at training. It follows that the scales would, or should, tip towards the consistent trainers.

Speaking of consistent trainers, the Iron Man Award goes to Jay Farlow followed by Thomas Aylett. Of the 26 training sessions held they attended 25 and 21 respectively. Well-done guys.

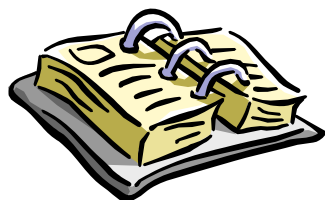

## **FOOD for THOUGHT**

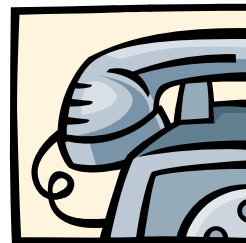
