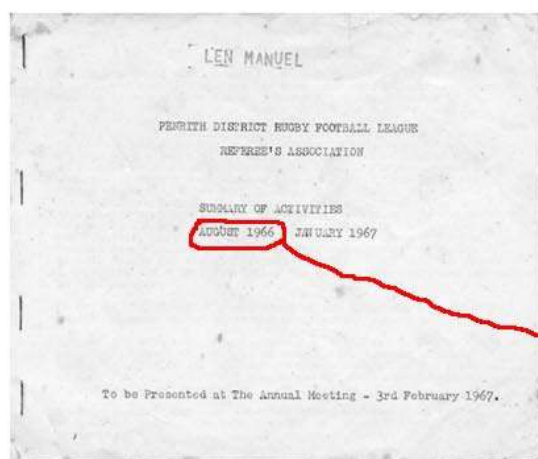




39th Annual Report and Financial Statement

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Forward

In the mid 1960's, the NSWRL first grade competition consisted of only 10 teams, they were Balmain, Western Suburbs, Eastern Suburbs, South Sydney, North Sydney, Manly-Warringah, Canterbury-Bankstown, St George, Newtown and Parramatta. The decision was made to promote two teams from the then second division (the equivalent of today's Jim Beam Cup) to the First Grade. The two teams chosen were Penrith and Cronulla Sutherland. The Penrith District was born.

The Penrith District Rugby League Referees Association was formed on the 24th August 1966. Ten members attended the inaugural meeting, they were;

These men started this Association and very quickly worked hard at growing the numbers required to service such a large district.

Many people have served long and hard over the years but, at the risk of upsetting someone, three members are absolute standouts. Don Courts who has served in some capacity continuously from 1966 to today, Jack Harris who guided the Association through the early years as president even though he was graded and was still active until moving to the country in 1997, and Gary Haines who was Junior Branch Secretary in 1975 (Feelin' old yet???) and has served with distinction in many of the Association's harder roles ever since.

Off course the efforts of people such as Keith French, Len Manuel, Jack Turner, Merv Edwards (who has the distinction of being the first Referee graded from Penrith), Les Brennan, Bob Kandelas, Trevor Murphy, Reg Newsome, Phil Sanders, Joe Beacroft, Peter Filmer, Peter Browne, Tony Danks and Barry Beveridge should not be understated, but merely serve to inspire those of us here today, to greater things.

We are so lucky to have had the calibre of these members amongst others to guide our Association in its infancy and place us at the forefront of Refereeing as we are today. As we enter our fortieth year, we should pause to reflect at the wonderful work that has enabled us to move forward and become the Association that we are.

They say that life begins at forty! If that's true (and personally I hope it is) then we are in for some wonderful times ahead given the good things that have happened up to now.

Presidents Report

I will open my report with the announcement that the District Club has agreed to administration grant of \$5,000.00 and an increase in our training and development grant to \$5,000.00 per season which will be available for the next 2 seasons and then subject to review. This came about after I had held a number of meetings with Michael Leary and the District Club. The District club and in particular Michael are to be thanked for their support of our Association. Our unanimous general committee decision to

re-affiliate with the District Club was a major contributing factor in obtaining these grants, along with our sponsorship from our new sponsor WATTS COMMERCIAL FURNITURE should ensure the Association has a stable financial base to build for the future.

To enhance our viability and stability for the coming years Jason Robinson has developed a five year "Plan For The Future 2006 – 2010" which contains amongst other items some proposed changes to the management structure of the Association which if endorsed shall see us progressing with the times.

Again in 2005 there is still a concern for the safety of referees and our Association has been proactive in that Brett Lynch has developed a policy for the protection of referees. This policy is currently with the Junior League for review and comment and with some minor adjustments should be available for implementation in time for the 2006 season. It must be noted however, such policies or procedures will not stop some of the confrontations to our referees, but will significantly reduce the number of occurrences. With our Association working closely with the Junior League the message may eventually sink in to those who confront or intimidate our referees.

Notwithstanding the running costs, the Association is increasing yearly stricter budgeting and accountability by the various "managers" with portfolios, which had a financial impact on the Association's finances and helped to achieve a major turn around in our profit and loss accounts for 2005. From an audited \$18,000.00 "trading loss" in 2004 we have achieved an acceptable "trading profit" for 2005, and the Treasurer should be congratulated for this achievement.

The Boards of Management of our Association and the Junior League met on two occasions throughout the season. We discussed and debated matters that related to both bodies on and off the field with each meeting producing positive outcomes. Thereby strengthening our relationship with the Junior League at both BOM and grass root levels and it was agreed these meetings would continue.

As in previous years the commitment to training was exceptional and all referees who attended training on a regular basis, (especially the newer and younger referees), gained invaluable experience from the trainers and senior members of our Association.

Secretary's Report

Members,

It gives me great pleasure to present to you the 39th Annual Report and Financial Statement of the Penrith District Rugby League Referees' Association.

I would like to apologise to the members for the length of my individual report. My excitement about the future of this Association, our on-field talent and off-field management, however, makes it very difficult to condense the Association's achievements and potential.

Season 2005 saw a great deal of changes within the Association, relating to our on-field and off-field operations. After several years as the Association's Referees Coordinator, Gary Haines decided not to stand for that position in 2005. Gary's hard work, commitment and dedication saw the standard of officiating grow during his tenure, with his commitment to development bearing fruits at many levels. The Association, and indeed the active members, owe Gary a great deal of thanks for his devotion to the members and every task that he has undertaken.

Gary's "retirement" led to a new look Executive and Board of Management elected at the Annual General Meeting, with the President, John Robinson, the only existing Executive member to retain his post. New to the Executive this year were Vice President Fred Lucas, Treasurer Greg Yates, myself, with Brett Lynch changing roles to fill the Coordinators position. The remainder of the Board was made up of fresh, young and enthusiastic members, namely John Woods, Jay Farlow, Thomas Aylett, Phillip Haines and James Davidson.

Personally, I was excited to be working with such a passionate and dedicated group, who I consider as the future leaders of the Association. As individuals, and as a team, each showed commitment, honesty, pride and passion in their management of the Association's affairs. I have heard through the grape-vine that one or two of the current Board will not be standing again next season. To these members, and the entire Board, I would like to extend my sincere thanks to you, and say that I was proud to be part of your team.

The Association, this year, made some great progress in regards to our financial management, which has allowed us to better plan for the future. This will be the first time in ages that the Association has been in such a strong financial position. I would like to take this opportunity to thank Doug Delaney from DIZ Home Improvement for his support over the past few years. The Association was, at the start of the season, in a position whereby we needed to secure our medium-to-long term finances. This saw us part ways with DIZ, who had been a great supporter of the Association.

When the Board decided that the Association required a dedicated "Sponsorship Coordinator", Phillip Haines enthusiastically volunteered. Within three weeks of his appointment, Phil had secured a lucrative sponsorship arrangement with WATTS COMMERCIAL FURNITURE. The three-to-five year agreement is, I believe, the largest in the Association history. At WATTS' insistence, a percentage of the sponsorship must be spent on the most crucial area of Referee Development. Members should also remember that should WATTS receive any sales as a direct result of this partnership; the Association will receive a portion of that value. To lan

Since the 1990's (and possibly since the 1960's), the Association has attempted to secure financial support from the Penrith District Rugby League Football Club. Three District Club Chief Executives later, our President, John Robinson, and Panthers General Manager of Rugby League, Michael Leary, have negotiated an administration and development grant. While (the other) Robbo showed passion, commitment and tenacity, Michael has shown a great deal of vision, trust and respect in acknowledging this Association's contribution to Rugby League in this District.

The other "unsung hero's" who help contribute to our success, on and off the field, are Don Feltis, his Junior League Board and staff, such as the invaluable Helen Wright. Don, Chairman Jack Myers, Helen and all at the Penrith Junior League, have shown patience and understanding, support, protection and advice to ensure that our members are provided the best conditions of any Junior League. While it is true that there are sometimes criticisms from and/or about both organisations, and occasionally we "butt heads", I can assure the members that it is always for the right reasons. The success and strength of our Junior League is a testament to Don and his team, and is something that this Association has proudly contributed to.

A further change to our management this season was the implementation of the position of "Welfare Coordinator". Fred Lucas took up the role to provide our members with an advocacy in times of need away from football. As this position evolves, I believe it will be one of major importance to the members.

Much has been written elsewhere in this report about our on-field performances. From "Under 6's" to Test Matches, our members have performed admirably throughout season 2005. With over 6,000 Junior League matches played throughout the season, each and every active member deserves congratulations and thanks for the way in which you have undertaken your duties. Your commitment to Rugby League has ensured that football in this District grows in a safe, fair and professional manner. Brett Lynch, Referees' Coordinator, has done outstanding work this season, particularly in regards to Coaching and Development. I believe that Brett's vision is certainly the right direction for the Association.

Two members who have had profound influence on my career and my life were recognised this year with the presentation of Life Membership. Russell Turner was presented with Life Membership of our Association, and Allan Farlow received Life Membership of NSW Rugby League Referees Association. Both men were truly deserving recipients, and are great role models for all members.

While the Association has great cause to celebrate this season, we must also take time to reflect on the passing of an Association stalwart. Phil Sanders joined the Association just a few months after the Association was formed, and some forty years later was still as passionate and dedicated as he was that day.

Unfortunately, for those who never knew "The Colonel" (and that was a nickname I would NEVER have used to his face!), the written word will never do justice to his legacy. Those of us fortunate enough to have met him will remember Phil for his pride, dedication, commitment – particularly to Junior referees, passion, toughness and discipline. If each of us has just a portion of Phil's characteristics, the Association will be in good hands for years to come.



Len and Nancy Manuel have also recently fallen on hard times. At the time of writing this report, Nancy is seriously ill in hospital. Reg Newsome's family have also had to deal with family tragedy recently. Our thoughts are with Len and Reg.

This season was a challenging one for me personally. I would like to thank all members for their contributions, especially:

- Brett Lynch, for his advice, support and help at any time.
- Greg Yates, in his first year as Treasurer performed remarkable and efficient financial management.

- The Board, for your Leadership and courage. As I've stated before, I believe that you will be the future leaders of the Association.
- The "go to" men. Gary Haines, Peter Browne and Don Courts. Without the support, advice and experience of these men, I would truly be lost.

As the Annual Report goes to print, I will be in the United Kingdom, having been given a fantastic opportunity to officiate in the Tri-Nations Test Matches. With me being "temporarily indisposed", Brett and Greg have been looking after the Association and the Annual Report. Thank you both very much, I am truly grateful.

To my wife, Jenny and daughter Natasha, I am truly indebted to you for your help, support and understanding in whatever I do. You are my inspiration.

Referees Coordinator Report

I am pleased to present my report to the members for the 2005 season.

In what was sometimes a baptism of fire, I believe we have come through the current season a stronger group of Referees than when we started.

The season started in mid October 2004, when the Talented Referees Program kicked into gear and we commenced training. The Referees involved received higher level training from some of the Association's finest Referees and this was reflected in the way many of them performed throughout the season just gone. The only disappointing aspect of the summer training was the absence of some of our leading Referees who had other commitments.

The following is a line from the coordinators report in 2004 "Saturday football was a major challenge in 2004", this in fact could be a line from any annual report since 1967. Saturday football is and remains our toughest challenge. The magnitude of changes that are required to cover one or two pull-outs is enormous as evidenced by the "yellow highlighting" (*visual effect of yellow highlighting removed for printing – Sec.*) on the Thursday changes. Somehow, Barry Beveridge managed to cope and conjured up some Referees to assist. The scope of this task on a week to week basis should not be underestimated. Special mention should be made of the work done by Casey Wouters, Col Smith, Phil Whilesmith, Barry Beveridge, Fred Lucas, Col Potts, Paul Burton, Brian Waiting and Chris Heinemeyer assisting the Saturday referees – I thank you all for your efforts.

Last season we introduced a mentoring program for the new referees. This season, it would be fair to say that we didn't do as well in this area. With the perseverance of both Phil Haines and Jason Robinson, we hope to get this valuable scheme back on track for the 2006 season. One of the reasons that it went a bit "pear shaped" this year was the number of members selected in the Junior Representative Squad. Having watched these games over a number of years, it would be fair to say that Penrith will continue to dominate the squad for many years to come.

Training this year was reasonably well attended and rewarding for those who did attend. There was an appointments board meeting in late May where Chris Heinemeyer rattled off a list of names and asked if they were regular trainers. When told they were, his reply was "it's obvious, they are performing better than those who don't" My advice to everyone is, if you can find the time, make the effort, the rewards from training are there for all to see.

The annual training challenge with Parramatta was held again this year. The Penrith team proved far too good, easily securing the trophy. Congratulations to all who participated. The only downside was the lack of rules knowledge by both camps.

Speaking of the rules, it is an area that we must continue to get right. When I get complaints from clubs, they are generally easy to answer. If the complaint relates to a ruling error, I simply can't defend any Referee. For those who enjoyed (and those who did not) the Rules Quizzes this year, I can promise more next season.



In the Graded arena, Penrith Referees continued to do well, dominated by Jason Robinson who had a good year in First Grade. He was ably supported by Russell Turner the specialist Friday Night Touch Judge. Peter Sciberras, Phil Haines and Rickey McFarlane also performed well. Grant Atkins and Melissa Yates were appointed to Semi Finals and Tristan K'Nell capped off a fine year by officiating in the Harold Matthews Grand Final. With the number of talented juniors biting at their heels, the number of Penrith Referees in this squad will only grow in the years ahead. I will say that we need to work a little harder to ensure each and every incident, no matter how small, must be reported. I have a little surprise for this area next year to improve our reporting.

In Memoriam – Phillip Sanders

I have known and been a friend of Phil for the past 38 years. I first met him when he was a member of a new batch of referees who joined in 1967 to help start the new Penrith Association. He joined the Association at an age when most people were retiring from refereeing.

Phil has impressed me by his loyalty to all those who were associated with him. He was the first person to defend a referee when they came under criticism and he was often involved in disputes in their defence. At the same time Phil would let you know if he felt that you were letting the Association down. He was most forthright in his comments and I know because I copped it from him straight between the eyes when as a member of the executive we forgot to send an invitation to Mavis Kandelas for the Ladies night. To this day I still check to see that we have done the right thing each year. Often Phil's directness would upset people but he was only trying to help build the Association to the high position in which it is held today.

Phil was a dedicated and untiring worker for the Association. He held many positions including Social Secretary and Appointments Board as well as working hard in many committees. Phil suffered from a disabling sickness but he did not let this stop him. No task was too great or job too small. He thoroughly deserved being awarded his Life Membership in 1979. Perhaps this was the cause of Phil's greatest disappointment in that during the later years he was not able to become involved as much as he wanted.

Phil was a family man who always had great support from Val. One of the first questions Phil would greet me with each time we met was how are the family? When asked the same question he could always update me on each member of his family. During his stay in the Nursing Home he took great pride in the photos of his grandchildren hanging on the wall of his room. Even the last month when he found it hard to communicate he would still lighten up when I talked to him about his family.

Phil was a compassionate and caring person. I remember well when we were asked to discipline Phil for interfering with the running of a game. Phil had seen a player tackled and injured. He was upset and entered the field when the play was stopped and stopped the player from being moved until some professional advice was sought. This was long before the appointment of trainers and medical personnel we have today. Phil was also the first to support any member of the Association who was undergoing problems.

He was a great support to Barbara and me 17 years ago when I was here for another reason.

I would like to pay tribute to Phil for his effort and service to Rugby League in the Penrith District. He has been a hard working devoted member of our Association and he has help to foster and build our image to the high standing which now exists.

To you Maryanne and Trish and family thank you for sharing Phil with us. At times you must have thought we had stolen him as he gave us so much of his time. Our thoughts are with each of you at this time.

National Rugby League Report

The 2005 National Rugby League squad came together from the off-season in mid-November 2004. An early body-fat test saw all but 4 members placed in “fat club” which meant extra training sessions every week for everyone until they moved out of the group.

For the first time, Sideline Officials were employed by the NRL on a part-time basis. Every Monday the entire squad of 25 members were able to train and prepare as one group. This provided opportunities that were never presented before, and the initiative proved to be invaluable to all involved.

Penrith Referees Association was represented by 3 members in the squad; Jason Robinson, Russell Turner and Peter Sciberras.

There was a new-found emphasis on TEAM and most off-season group training sessions were based on group activities. These included sand hills, beach sprints, duathlons, triathlons, cycling races and yoga. Spread amongst these group sessions were individual gym, weights, rowing and bike activities. This added up to around 12 training sessions per week, with all of these designed to keep us off our weary legs that had carried us through the season before.

Just prior to Christmas the entire squad participated in a 2-day Eco-challenge, where the mind and body of all participants were pushed to their physical and mental limits. Activities over the weekend included long-distance cross-country running, canoeing, high wire trapeze, initiative and leadership challenges, many short aerobic activities, endurance dragon boat racing, sand hills, beach run and (finally) finished off with a surf carnival. To make things interesting, most of this was done while team members also carried a 2-metre log, which could not be put down at any time.

After a short New Year break, pre-season began with Keith Onslow, one of our coaching staff, providing us with the basic skills and knowledge that players display week in and week out. “Standing pass”, “Hands to the ball” and “Unders or overs line” became standard vocab at training sessions.

The TEAM concept was further emphasised with Robert Finch also utilising the skills of former Australian Swim Coach, Bill Nelson. Bill helped all the members draw up team goals, values, preparation protocol and measuring tools that would prove invaluable throughout the year ahead.

Finally the season commenced, and the trial matches started with the experiments of:

- Interchange referees – at specific times during the match the central referee would swap places with a sideline official and then, if required, would change back.
- Sideline Officials with no flags – Any signals would be given by hand and communicated through the communications gear.

The league reviewed these concepts and decided to leave the “spears” in the hand of the “touchies” but continue with the interchange referees. After the 5-week trial period this concept was also put back on the shelf.



Before the start of the season we farewelled Steve Nash, a veteran touch judge who moved up into the grandstand to his new role of video referee. We welcomed Englishman Russell Smith, a veteran Test referee who inspires all with his training attitude and physical strength.

Then, finally, the season started.

Jason began the year as an interchange referee and participated in some of these games. Throughout the year Jason also was appointed as central referee to 18 matches and performed very well in these games. Unfortunately Robbo was also one of a number of the “non-established” referees who were jockeying for a slightly less number of games, and as such moved up and down to and from NSWRL a number of times during the year. His highlight of the season was simply being a part of the greatest season in history. He finished the season with a very respectable career total of 38 matches under his belt, and is looking forward to increasing that total next year.

Russell started the season in Round 1 and for the first time made it past Round 3 without an error. However in Round 4 a problem with a touch line/video referee process saw him fall back to Premier League for a week. On his return he went through the remainder of the season without too many issues and managed to get 30 games through the season, including a Quarter Final appointment and standby for the remainder of the Semi-Finals series, meaning that he finished the year ranked in the top 6 touch judges in the NRL. Russell says that his season highlights were officiating at the traditional Sydney venues at matches where ground records were set this year – Leichhardt, Campbelltown and Kogarah. At the end of the season Russell finished with 97 games on the sideline at the NRL level. Post-season saw Russell appointed to an international match between Samoa and Tonga, as part of the Pacific Cup competition.

Peter showed massive mental toughness to complete the Eco-challenge despite an early injury, and inspired other members of his team with his never-say-die attitude. He also attended every mid-week training session which was a big ask considering his work, family and NSWRL commitments. Despite showing all of these positives Peter was not selected to officiate at NRL level this season. However part of the on-field achievements of all NRL referees can be attributed to the teamwork and dedication that Peter led with off the field.

Through the year we also welcomed debutantes Daryn Lang (Manly), Alan Shortall (Parramatta), Jason Walsh (Manly) and Mohammed Fojajo (Canterbury) who excelled in their new roles.

Before we knew it, the season was over. Congratulations to referee Tim Mander, Sideline Officials Steve Carrall and Matt Cecchin, and Video Referee Graeme West for their big appointment at the end of the year. Steve Chiddy was appointed to the match but unfortunately was ruled out with injury. Well done as well to all officials who officiated every week and in particular to the Penrith members of the NRL squad.

Rugby League is better than ever, bigger crowds, closer competition, faster games but, according to the media, the refereeing is worse than ever. The effort that is put in by all members for the 11 months of the year is never appreciated by Joe Public



(some cynics remind us that, according to the media – the Referees in 1908 were terrible, and they've been worse every season since – Sec.). We all realise that this perception will never change as long as media outlets have to keep selling newspapers and chasing ratings.

Anyway, it was a great 2005 at NRL level; by the time you read this we'll be working hard to make sure that 2006 is even better.

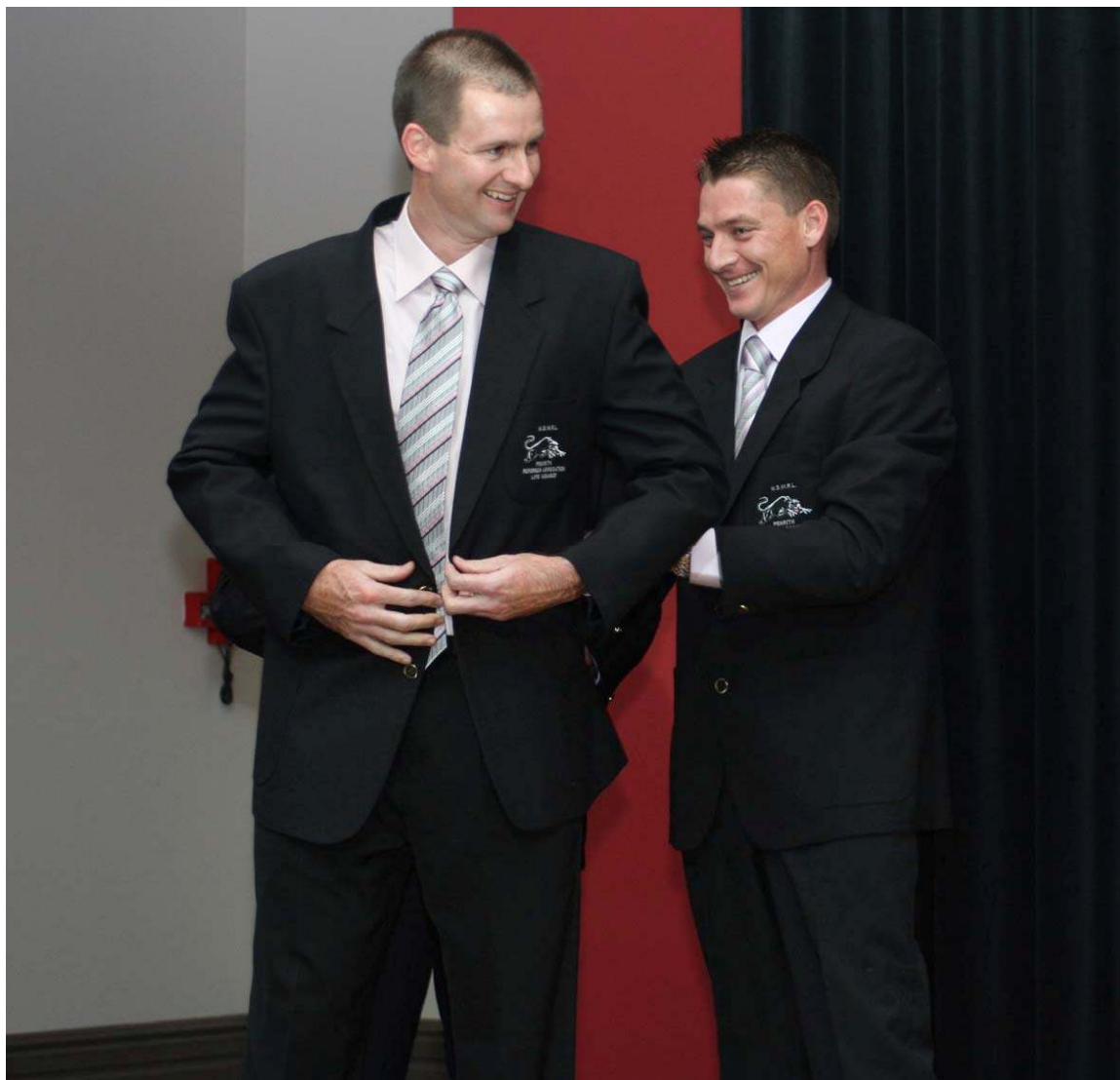

The Jack Harris Merit Award is our Association's most prestigious award.

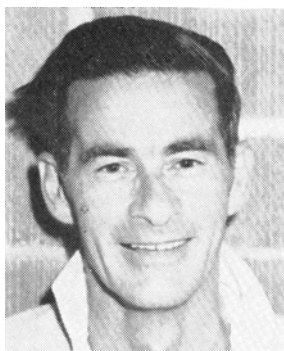

This year's winner was Greg Yates.

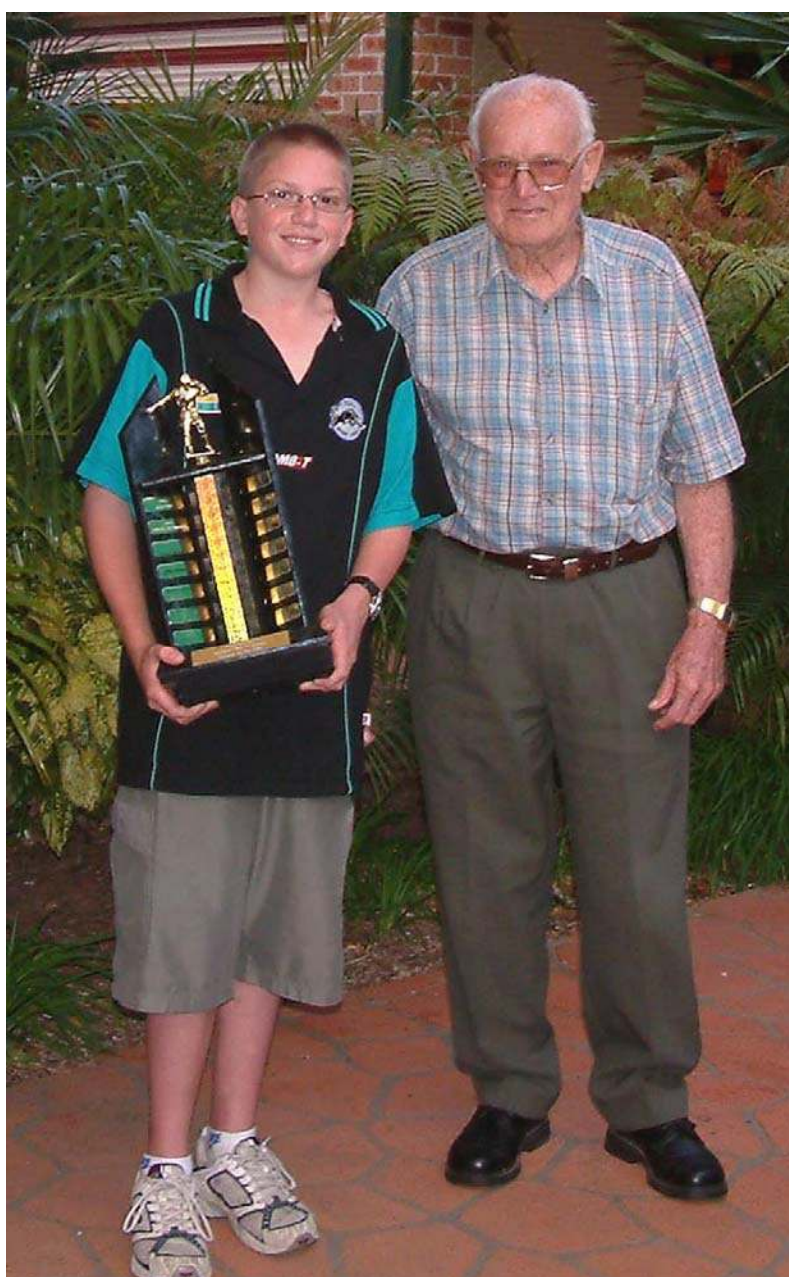




Len Manuel Rookie of the Year
